







#### **Original Design Idea by Estelle**

I chose to make a hopscotch at the sports court. This is a good place to show respect for the Saklan people because special events happen there. We also have a special hopscotch tournament every year and we do PE there. I drew numbers and a basket pattern which is important to Saklan culture because baskets are [traditionally] used for [carrying] food, cooking, holding water, as gifts, and more. When making my design I made sure to use appropriate patterns and colors [but still needed more information on accurate Saklan basket weave patterns.] I used pink, green, and brown to color the hopscotch which shows respect to the Saklan people because green is balance, and balance is a Bay Miwok value. Pink is respect which is also a value and brown is an accurate basket color






## Hopscotch Design Color Plan Revision






We are still researching the types of paint we need, available colors and how to mix them etc. We may experience limitations here depending on our access to ground mural paint materials




# Hopscotch Design Language Revision

Deeper yellow, red, and grey are all inspired by the Mission Dolores ceiling painted by Mission Indians.




#### **Proposed Location**

- It is where the hopscotch tournament happens







#### Original Design Idea by Adora

I chose to make a foursquare at the sports court. This is a good place to show respect for the Saklan people because adults and students come here for CLAS. Also K-8th graders do PE with Mr. Crabtree here and sometimes they play foursquare. I chose to draw a winnowing basket. It is important because it helps take the skin off the acorn for preparing meals. [Acorns are an important food in the Saklan culture]. We met Louis and Vincent from Cafe Ohlone and we learned a lot like how they respect nature by leaving the 1st acorns for the animals and how using traditional tools like this basket to prepare food makes them feel connected to their culture. I used brown, blue, and violet. Brown represents resistance. The blue in the background represents peace.




Suggested we use one of their family's baskets as the design inspiration. And sent us a photo to use for our design revision
